What is it?

The Evening Medical Updates (EMU) programme covers the 'Top Medical Presentations' and 'Emergency Presentations' as defined in the GIM training curriculum. The 26 topics are covered in a rolling programme, with monthly updates held between September and June of each academic year.

Each EMU consists of three 30-minute presentations. The programme allows time for discussion and questions with contributions from all centres.

Who can attend?

Although aimed particularly at core trainees, Evening Medical Updates are open to **all hospital doctors, GPs, other healthcare professionals, and medical students**. They are **free of charge** to all. Updates are held at the College in Edinburgh but *streamed live to a number of other centres around the UK and further afield* (see **Live Links** for the current list of venues).

The first commences on **Tuesday 27 September 2016** and will cover 'The Shocked Patient' (see Programme enclosed for further details) and will run from **6.30 pm to approximately 8.15 pm**.
