In general, any text or material generated by AI tools and presented as part of assessed work must be regarded as source material that requires referencing in footnotes and Bibliography/List of Works Cited, according to the usual protocols and forms of acknowledgement (Tool/source, date) PLUS a clear statement of the prompts used. If you are in any doubt, refer to the assessment instructions and/or ask your module leader or personal tutor for guidance. In all cases where it is suspected that a student has not legitimately authored the work they have submitted as their own, they will be subject to our existing [Academic Integrity](#) procedures.
