### Year 2 Assessments & Progression to Year 3

- Written grades on the basis of paper cut scores
  - < cutscore Unsatisfactory</li>
  - ≥cutscore Satisfactory
  - ETA4/5 and ETA6 considered separately
- OSCE (out of 8 stations)
  - < 5 Unsatisfactory
  - ≥ 5 Satisfactory
- Narrative Medicine: Need to pass 6/8 outcomes to be satisfactory
- Students must be satisfactory in all assessments to progress
  - There is one resit opportunity at the end of each year
  - Students only resit the component(s) they fail:
    - ETA4/5 and/or ETA6 QE2 Written
    - OSCE2 QE2 OSCE
    - NM term 5 assessment reassessment in term 6

# **Progression regulations**

Defined set of progression rules (previous slide)

QE is an additional opportunity to pass the year available to all students that need it for whatever reason

Unsatisfactory QE: Course termination is the default outcome

Exam board has the option to offer a repeat year for students with approved mitigating circumstances.



# What are mitigating circumstances?

Mitigating circumstances are defined as "<u>unexpected</u> events, <u>beyond the student's</u> <u>control</u>, that might have a <u>significant and adverse impact</u> on their academic performance".

"Unexpected": not known to you before beginning your course or stage of study or the severity or impact on your studies would not reasonably have been predicted.

"Beyond the student's control": you could not have reasonably prevented the circumstances from happening or their impact on your studies.

"A significant and adverse impact on their academic performance": disruptive enough to have a meaningful adverse impact on your ability to engage with your course and/or on your academic performance.



# Types of mitigation

### Absence from examination: not fit to sit

You are <u>unable</u> to attend a written exam and/or OSCE You are requesting an additional assessment attempt

#### Non-submission of coursework:

You are <u>unable</u> to meet a coursework deadline

You are requesting an extension

### **Poor performance:**

You have attended and/or submitted assessments but your preparation and/or performance may have been impacted by MCs

You are requesting a repeat year opportunity if you fail to progress

\*\*\*No changes to marks\*\*\*



# All applications require evidence

#### Of the circumstances

Bereavement e.g. death certificate

Crime e.g. Police report

Illness e.g. letter or other evidence from the treating doctor or other professional

Car accident e.g. insurance documentation

### Of their impact on your studies

Relevant timeframe

Significance of circumstances

What study activities were disrupted

Attempts to mitigate impact and/or obtain support

\*\*\*All evidence must be independent\*\*\*



# What the MC process is not for

### The following circumstances are not likely to be approved:

Transport delays

Holidays/Paid work

Errors in reading/understanding assessment instructions

Technology failure

Issues that could have been mitigated earlier

### The committee is also unable to consider:

Issues with the curriculum and/or assessment processes

Requests for reasonable adjustments

Requests to remark/review marks for assessments

Group applications

**Evidence** 

Statements from staff e.g. WSD, personal tutor

### **Deadlines**

As soon as you become aware of the circumstances

ETA6/OSCE2: 5th November 2025 for circumstances occurring immediately prior to or during the exams

QE: 22nd December 2025 <u>9am</u> for circumstances occurring immediately prior to or during the exams

You must submit applications yourself

You must include everything you want to be considered



# Consideration of applications

#### **Panel**

Includes lay members

### The following are considered alongside your application/evidence:

Previous MC applications

Engagement with support/occupational health/other relevant services

Your stage of study and the expectations of a doctor

#### Not considered:

Evidence you have not provided (the committee will not gather evidence for you or accept your word alone)

Evidence that is not independent or that is found to be falsified

Academic performance



### **Decisions**

Accepted
Partially accepted
Not accepted

No marks are changed

Decisions passed to the examination board who determine the impact

Remainder of the application is confidential to the MC committee and student support team Additional recommendations may be made
